MANAGING ZOOM MEETINGS

You're probably spending at least part of your remote life on Zoom conference calls. If you are running Zoom meetings, here are some tips to help. To stop "Zoombombers" from crashing your party, avoid using your Personal Meeting ID to host events - generate a random meeting ID instead.

Manage Your Participants:

- Mute participants: Hosts can mute/unmute individual participants or all of them at once. Hosts can block unwanted, distracting, or inappropriate noise from other participants. You can also enable Mute Upon Entry in your settings to keep the clamor at bay in large meetings.
- Screen sharing: to prevent participants from screen sharing during a call, using the host controls at the bottom, click the arrow next to Share Screen and then Advanced Sharing Options. Under "Who can share?" choose "Only Host" and close the window. You can also lock the Screen Share by default for all your meetings in your web setting.
- Disable video: Hosts can turn someone's video off. This will allow hosts to block unwanted, distracting, or inappropriate gestures on video or for that time your friend's inside pocket is the star of the show • Remove unwanted or disruptive participants: From that Participants menu,
- you can mouse over a participant's name, and several options will appear, including Remove. Click that to kick someone out of the meeting • Turn off file transfer: In-meeting file transfer allows people to share files
- through the in-meeting chat. Toggle this off to keep the chat from getting bombarded with unsolicited pics, GIFs, memes, and other content. • Turn off annotation: You and your attendees can doodle and mark up content together using annotations during screen share. You can disable the
- annotation feature in your Zoom settings to prevent people from writing all over the screens. **Links to Additional Information**

Zoom has lots of helpful tips on their official blog. The FBI has expressed their concerns about Zoombombing, as has the Anti-Defamation League.




