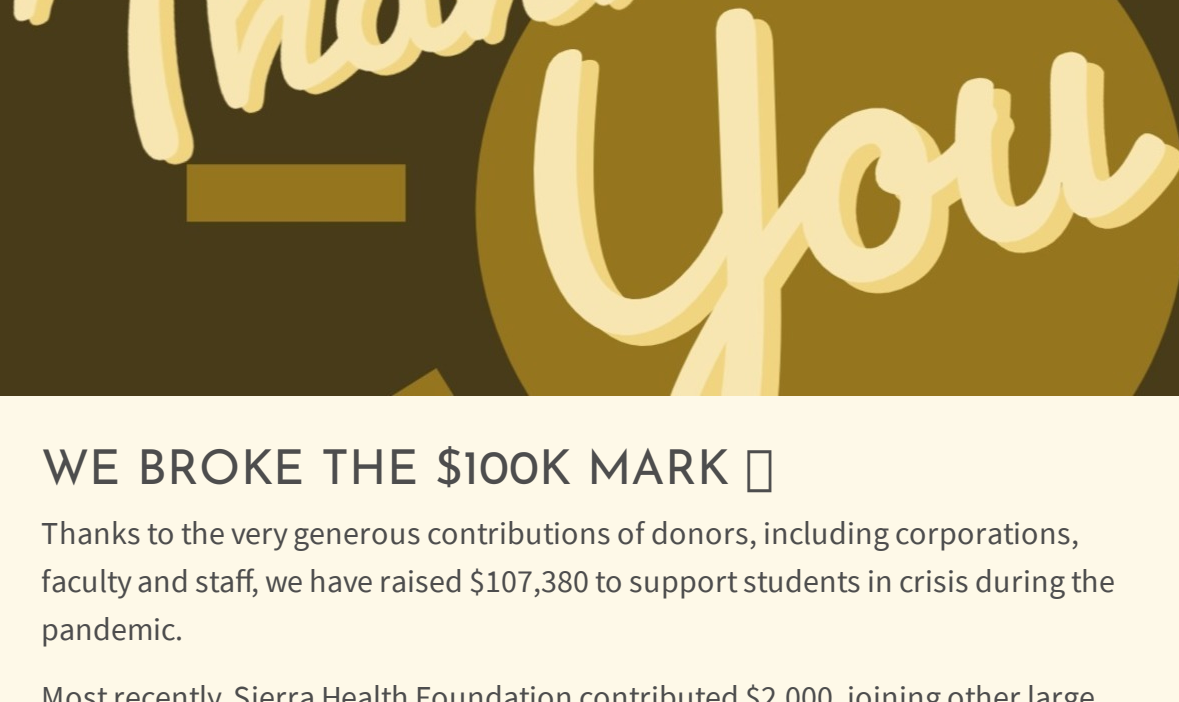

ONLINE CATALOG IS LIVE!

All Los Rios college catalogs, including SCC's, are now available online, making it easier than ever for students to get information they need at their fingertips!

The transition to online catalogs began before our current public health crisis and move to remote operations, but the work has accelerated in the past few weeks to ensure that we have a functional online catalog for students. Even when our current crisis is over, our students will dramatically benefit from the ability to have a more modern and interactive catalog. Some key points worth noting about the online catalog:

- **Mobile Responsive and Accessible** - The online catalogs are mobile responsive, ensuring students to access it from their mobile device wherever and whenever they want (as opposed to the old PDF versions we used to have online, which were not responsive and presented accessibility challenges for students and staff).
- **Integration with Socrates** - With the launch of our new websites, we had already begun the seamless integration of Socrates content into a student-facing portal. Now, Socrates content will seamlessly integrate with our official college catalogs as well.
- **More Up to Date Information** - By eliminating the time involved in the printing process, our catalogs will be more accurate when the official catalog goes live each year before June 1, reducing the amount of updates necessary throughout the year (you'll note the title "Unofficial Catalog Preview," which will be in place until the "Official Catalog" is live on June 1).
- **Printable Versions** - Printable PDF versions of the full catalog, or specific sections, are still available for download from the site so that students, faculty and staff who need printed versions can access them easily. When on-campus operations have resumed, each college will be able to provide some printed versions on demand.
- **Translations** - Because our websites have a translation feature, catalogs will now be able to be translated into multiple languages for students (we recognize that automated translation tools are imperfect, but we've historically not had any translated versions of our catalog so this marks a substantial benefit for many students like our ESL populations).
- **Cost Savings** - This new model will save all of our colleges tens of thousands of dollars, critically important as we head into some challenging budget times. This doesn't even include the hundreds of staff hours each year invested in the print catalog at our four colleges.
- **Full Compliance** - All board policy, Title IV and accreditation requirements have been considered and accounted for.
- **Spring "Update"** - There will be a catalog "update" in the Spring, serving the same purpose as addenda have historically.

EXCELLENCE AWARD NOMS DUE 4/24

The Celebration of Excellence is an annual event recognizing special people who have played an important role in building the success of Sacramento City College. Once again, the Honors and Awards Committee is recognizing employees for the Individual Excellence Award and the Team Excellence Award for exemplary performance and achievement.

Nominations are due Friday, April 24, 2020 by 11:59 p.m.

The Individual Excellence Award is open for nominations of any administrative, certificated, or classified professional, full time, part time, or temporary, who has demonstrated excellence in their daily activities and contributed to the enhancement and prestige of the college. For the Team Excellence Award, a team is defined as a group of interdependent people who work collaboratively and closely together toward a common goal. Team members may not nominate their own team.

In order to submit a nomination, please:

1. Complete an [Individual Excellence Award nomination form](#) or [Team Excellence Award nomination form](#) (you will need to sign in to your Los Rios Google Apps account via your Wxxxxxx@apps.losrios.edu email address to complete either form); and
2. Create a 2-3 minute video nomination (1 GB limit), which you will upload to the nomination form. You may be as creative as you like. Please explain — with examples — why this nominee/team should be considered for the Excellence Award using the following seven criteria:

- Exhibits expertise in job area
- Performs job in an exemplary manner
- Works for the betterment of the college and its students
- Demonstrates qualities of leadership and/or initiative
- Represents the college with distinction in professional and community activities
- Earns the respect of fellow employees and/or students involved in campus events
- Volunteers time and energy above and beyond assignment

From The Express:

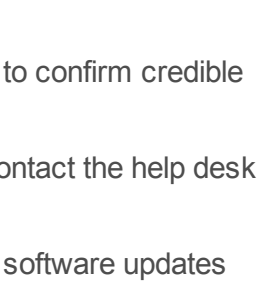

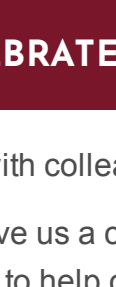

IT/Tech Tip of the Week: Information Security

Recently, there has been a dramatic increase in phishing emails, spam, and malware. Cybercriminals are using public apprehension over the coronavirus outbreak to advance their agendas. Emails purporting to contain information about the spread of the coronavirus will secretly download malware that allows hackers to steal information and deliver additional malware. We encourage you to:



- Be vigilant and exercise extreme caution when clicking links or opening attachments from outbound sources
- Carefully examine external email addresses and web links to confirm credible sources
- Beware of free software, solutions, and technologies and contact the help desk if you have questions or concerns
- Make sure that your computer is up to date on hardware & software updates including antivirus

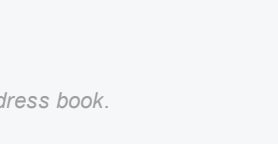

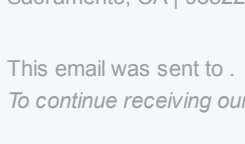
