Sacramento City College English Pathways Articulation Agreement

The English Department at SCC has entered into an articulation agreement with seven of our feeder high schools. These schools are:

C.K. McClatchy H.S. Hiram Johnson H.S. John F. Kennedy H.S. Luther Burbank H.S. River City H.S. Rosemont H.S. Sacramento H.S.

The agreement allows students to gain eligibility for ENGWR 300 in one of two ways (in addition to traditional assessment and the new MMAP models soon to be implemented district-wide in the LRCCD):

- Students who score "Standard Exceeded" on their 11th grade CAASPP/EAP test are eligible for ENGWR 300.
- Students who score "Standard Met" or "Standard Nearly Met" on their 11th grade CAASPP/EAP and who successfully complete the 12th grade ERWC course with a grade of "C" or better at one of our partner schools listed above are eligible for ENGWR 300.

This agreement is renewed annually and is based upon the English faculty at each high school participating in a curricular collaboration with the English faculty at Sacramento City College. The list of participating schools will be made available to counseling faculty at the conclusion of each school year. Currently, students from the following schools and graduating classes are eligible for this agreement:

In order to take advantage of this opportunity, students will need to submit their high school transcripts, 11th grade CAASPP/EAP results, and a completed prerequisite challenge form to the L&L Division Office. Any student who meets the criteria will have their prerequisite challenge approved and their milestone set in the system by the L&L staff. Students will then be able to enroll in any section of ENGWR 300.
