The Los Rios Community College District, effective Oct. 1, 2015, has established standard assessment practices for all four colleges, including important changes to retesting rules. These new practices will apply to every student, regardless of which college(s) they attend and which assessment test(s) they plan to take - English, Reading, English as a Second Language (ESL) and Math. If students have begun the course sequence, they may utilize the course challenge process in their college's appropriate academic department.

- If you have successfully completed a course in English, ESL, or Math: You may enroll in any subsequent course that uses the course you passed as a prerequisite (on the condition that you do not exceed the repeatability limitations).
- If you have only received non-sufficient grades ("W", "I", "D" or "F") in you English, ESL, or Math courses:

You can enroll into the course at the level you started based on previous assessment results (even if your assessment results have expired) or your transcript OR into the course at a lower level than the one you were previously enrolled (on the condition that you do not exceed the repeatability limitations).

> If you are unsatisfied with your current English or ESL course placement:

Go to the **SCC Language & Literature Department** to initiate a course challenge process:

- > If you are unsatisfied with your current Math course placement:

Go to the **Learning Resource Center** Room 144 (LRC 144) for the Initial Math Placement Challenge Process:

Enroll in LTAT 92 course (0.5 unit of credit per semester) This is a math review course. Students must complete 27 hours of work. Upon completion of LTAT 92 you will receive a certificate which must be presented at the Assessment Center before reassessment. The results of the new assessment will determine your final placement. It will overwrite your previous math level and it is not reversible. You may only use this process once.
