Completion and certification of ALL the requirements in the Cal-GETC will permit a student who transfers from a California Community College to a participating university campus without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education courses. *All courses must be completed with a "C" grade or better*. Students must meet with a counselor to request the Cal-GETC Certification, which can only be completed when all areas of the Cal-GETC are completed in their entirety.

NOTE: The Cal-GETC is NOT appropriate for some majors and/or campuses. Please see a counselor as Cal-GETC requirements may change. FA 2024 - SUM 2025 last IGETC and CSU GE pattern.

California State University, Sacramento (CSUS)

- 1. Race and Ethnicity Requirement (CSUS graduation requirement): As of August 21, 1998, CSUS requires 3 units to meet their Race and Ethnicity requirement. The following SCC courses have been approved to meet this requirement. COMM 325(SP06), ENGLT 334 (SP02), ETHNS 300 formerly SOCSC 300 (SU05), HIST 310 (FA10), HIST 311 (FA10), SOC 321 (SU05). CSUS continues to have this requirement in addition to AREA 6 above.
- 2. FOREIGN LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT (CSUS graduation requirement): Effective Summer 2004, the foreign language requirement can be met by one of the following:
 - a. Completion of two semesters (402 level at SCC) of a foreign language at a community college or university, with a grade of "C-" or better or
 - b. Completion of the third year of a foreign language with a "C-" grade or better in high school or
 - c. Advanced Placement Foreign Language Examination scores of 3, 4 or 5 or
 - d. Graduation from a high school (secondary school) where the language of instruction was not English or
 - e. See a counselor for other options.

The following majors (BS degree) are exempt from the foreign language requirement for graduation (Fall2013). Business Administration, Chemistry (BS only), Computer Science, Engineering, Health Sciences, Kinesiology- Exercise Science concentration, Nursing, Public Health, Physics (BS only), & Recreation, Parks and Tourism Administration.

3.ENGLISH COMPOSITION (CSUS graduation requirement): For students whose catalog is Fall 1992 or later, an additional English composition course is required for graduation (ENGL 20 at Sacramento State). SCC's ENGWR 301, ENGL C1001 (formerly 302), 303 (CSUGE A2) or ENGL C1001H (formerly ENGWR 482), will be accepted to meet this requirement. If the student is obtaining an Associate Degree for Transfer (ADT) English 20 CSUS course requirement is waived, and they will not need to complete SCC's ENGWR 301, 302 or 303, but may choose another course from AREA CSUGE A2.

4. CSU, Sacramento requires a total of 51 units of general education for graduation. Students may choose to take additional units from AREA 5A, 5B, 5C at SCC. The remaining 9 units of general education must be upper division and taken at the university level. Fall 2014 – Spring 2025 is a 48-unit pattern (39 units lower-division & 9 units upper-division). The new pattern, effective Fall 2025 is 43 units (34 lower-division & 9 upper-division).
