

Basic Mobile Solution

- Primarily On Ground Instruction
- High campus presence
- Office as Primary Base

Advanced Hybrid Solution

- Primarily Online Instruction
- Low campus presence
- Office as Destination for Collaboration & Socialization

Each position along the mobile / hybrid continuum has a unique Student & Employee experience, impact on organizational performance and real estate footprint

Mobile & Hybrid Working

Definition

- Recognize work patterns vary by role
- Work can be done in the office, at home and third places
- Based on work pattern offices and workstations may be shared
- Optimize all work mode

Differences

- Mobile strategies generally require everyone to be in the office every day (4 or 5 days per week)
- Hybrid strategies support working from other locations including home on some basis










