Our committe's goals, objectives, and open action items were to collaborate across campus with a more transparency as well as connect more directly with Operations and the VPRT with Mitch Campbell. Open action items specifically are to advance the collaboration with the Facility Master Plan advisory body and to better and more effectively work with other constituency groups around campus planning, use, repair, and advancement.

Describe action items that have been completed.

The CDC has worked dilegently with the VPRT around decision making while the VPRT has recently offered an update to the process with a more consolidated approach to moving projects along across the college. Additionally, the campus issue regarding fountains is proceeding forward. Working with Facilities Management allowed us to inventory the campus needs and they are now strategically being placed across the campus. The mural project has been a beautiful addition to our campus aesthetics and environmental preparation as well as the new landscape along Freeport and surrounding the Natural Sciences and Mohr Hall. A more recent project about aesthetics was to remove the portables as swing space on the north central side of the campus (11th Ave). Parking and landscape will beautify that portion of the campus. A meeting with the VPA on ADA/doors particularly in the first floor of the Rodda buildings. Finally, it has been discussed to be attentive to the charging stations as we continue to be mindful of our sustainability.

- Book store renovation or reimagine the Panther Cares to be the front door of the college, given the majority of people come from the parking garage and/or public transportation.
- North side of the Business building; removal of bike storage garage and the vending gazebo.

- Move the Land Acknowledgement to a more respectful space with a D/G path inside the landscape south of the parking and north of Natural sciences
- City Cafe minor updates with soft seating in the alcoves pending the larger FMP renovation.
 Reimagining the Bus Building as flex space and/or CITY Scholars and possible unification of Affinity groups.
