Survey Procedure

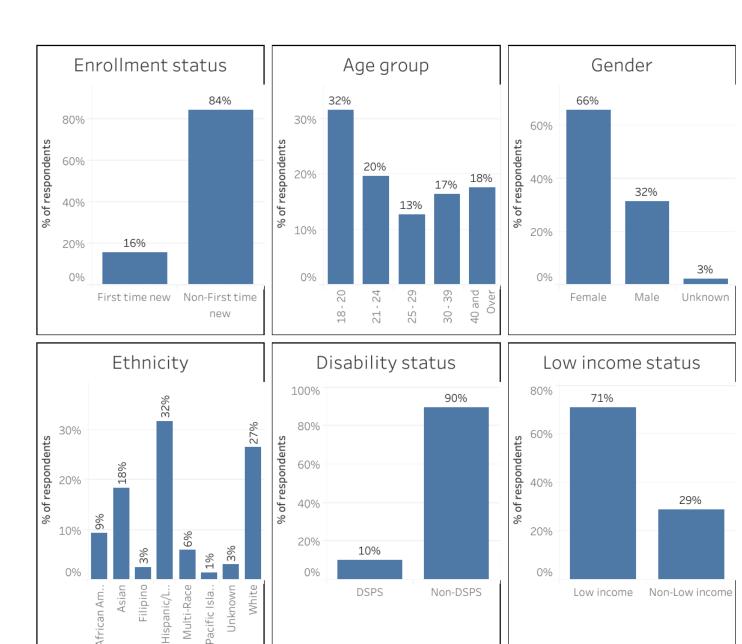
This survey was administered by PRIE toward the end of the Fall 2019 semester. Results of this survey, as show in this document, were analyzed by PRIE.

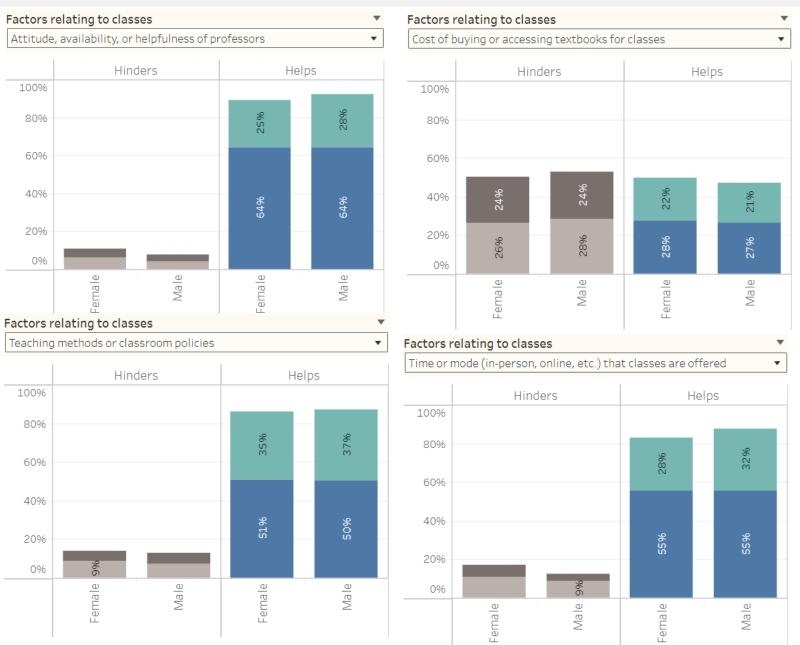


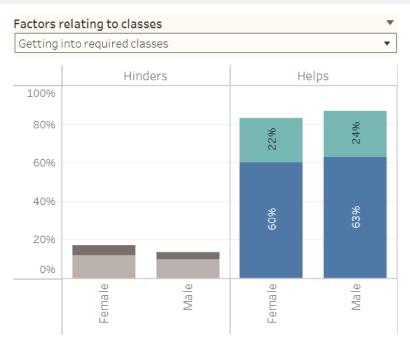


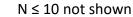




...of students by gender while taking into account factors concerning classes

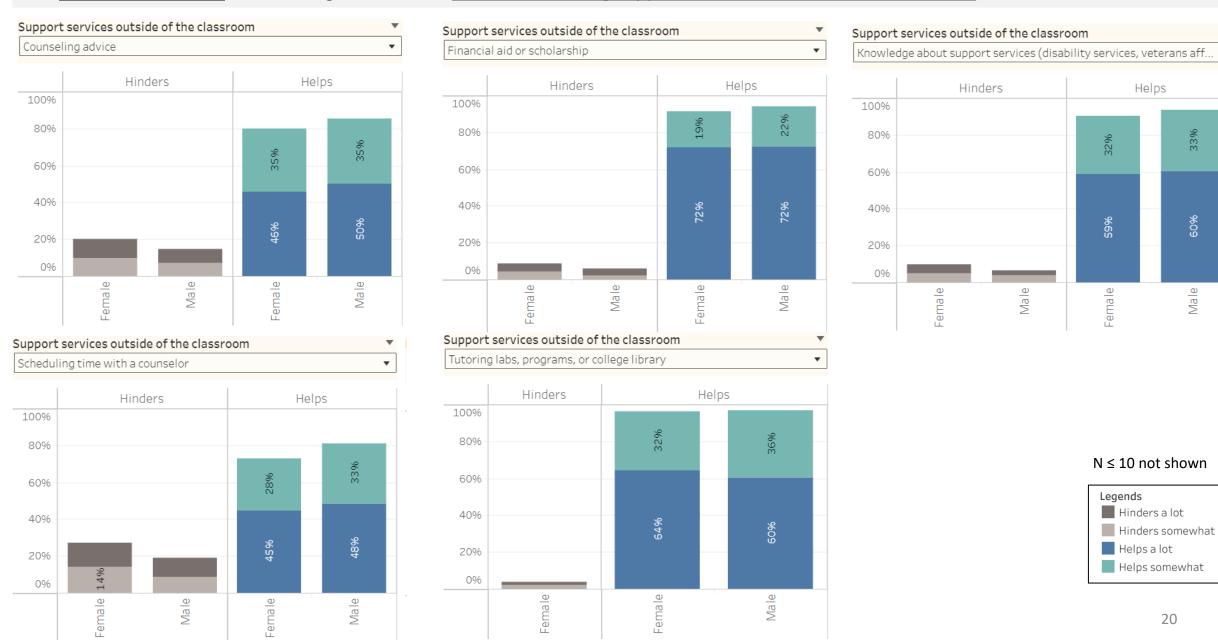

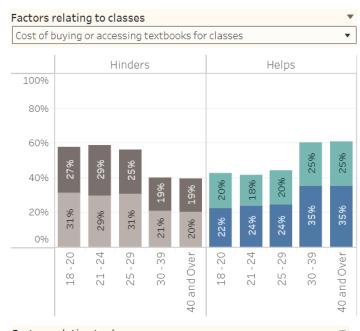


...of students by age group while taking into account factors concerning college, district, or state-wide rules

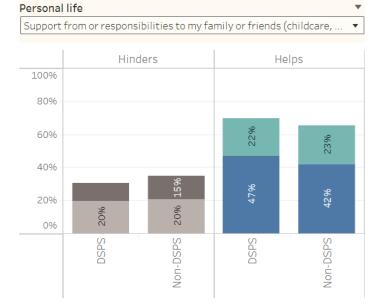




...of students by disability status while taking into account factors concerning personal life





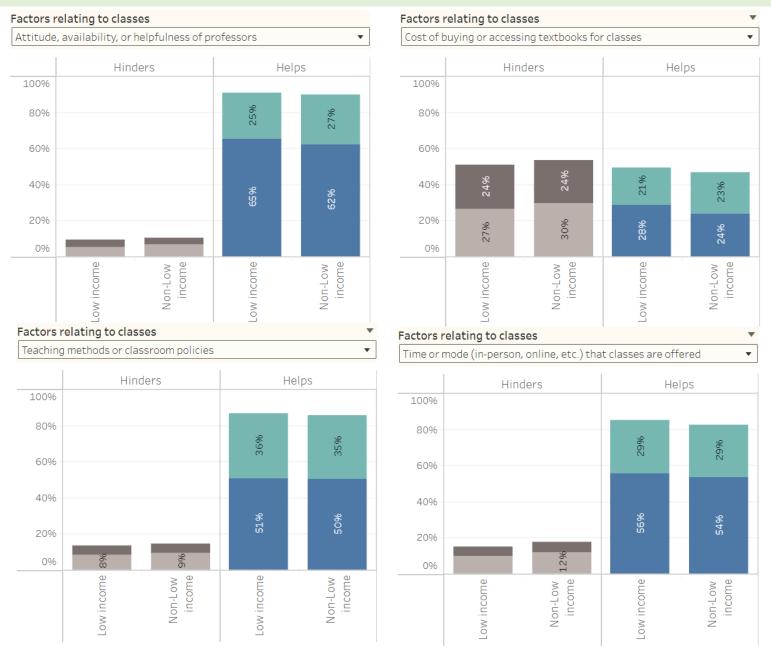


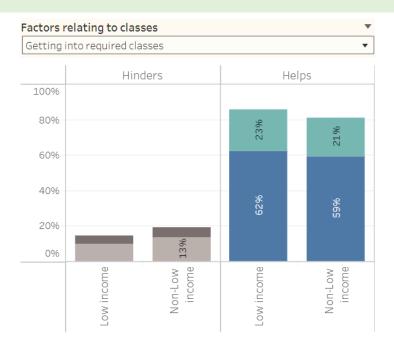


...of students by low-income status while taking into account factors concerning college, district, or state-wide rules



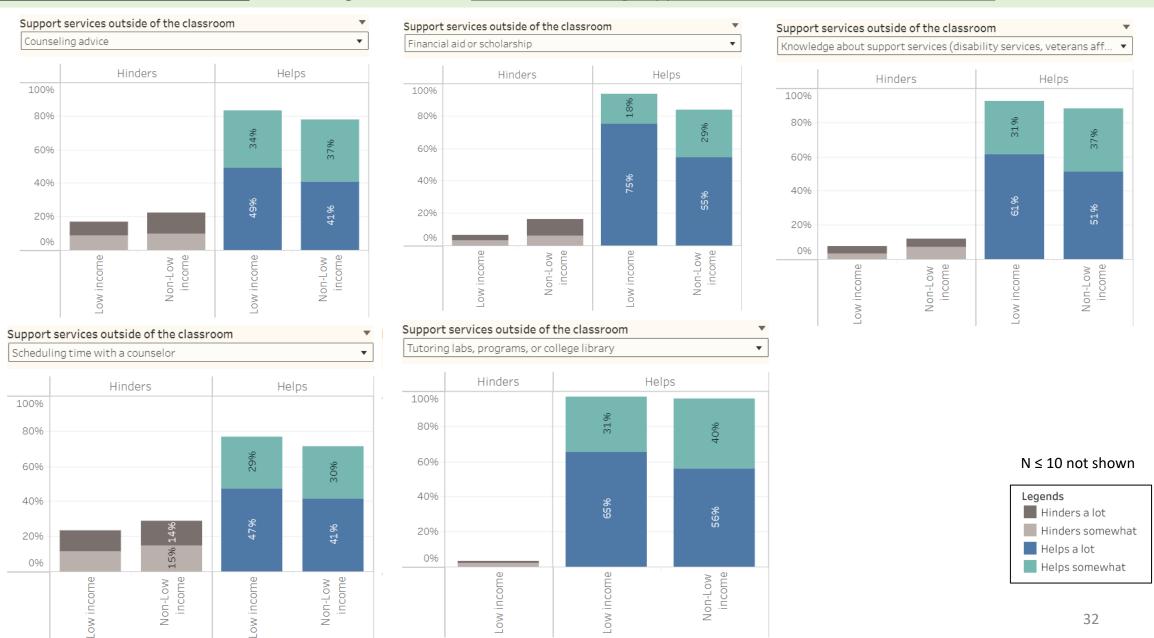
...of students by low-income status while taking into account factors concerning classes



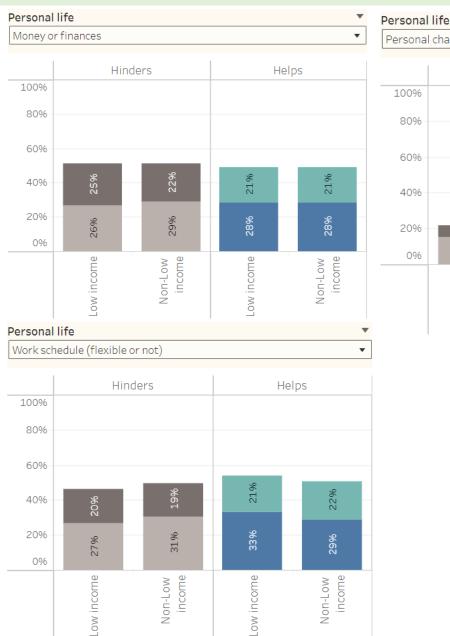


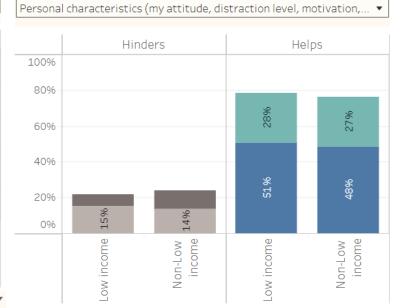


...of students by low-income status while taking into account factors concerning support services outside of the classroom

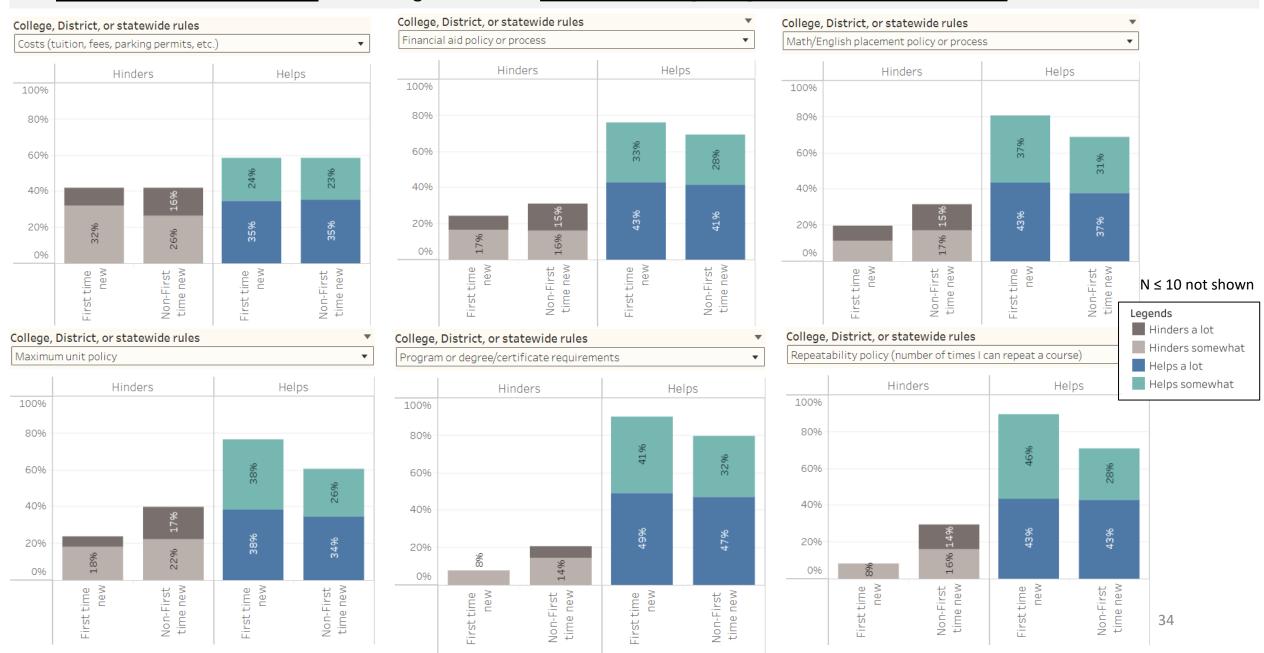

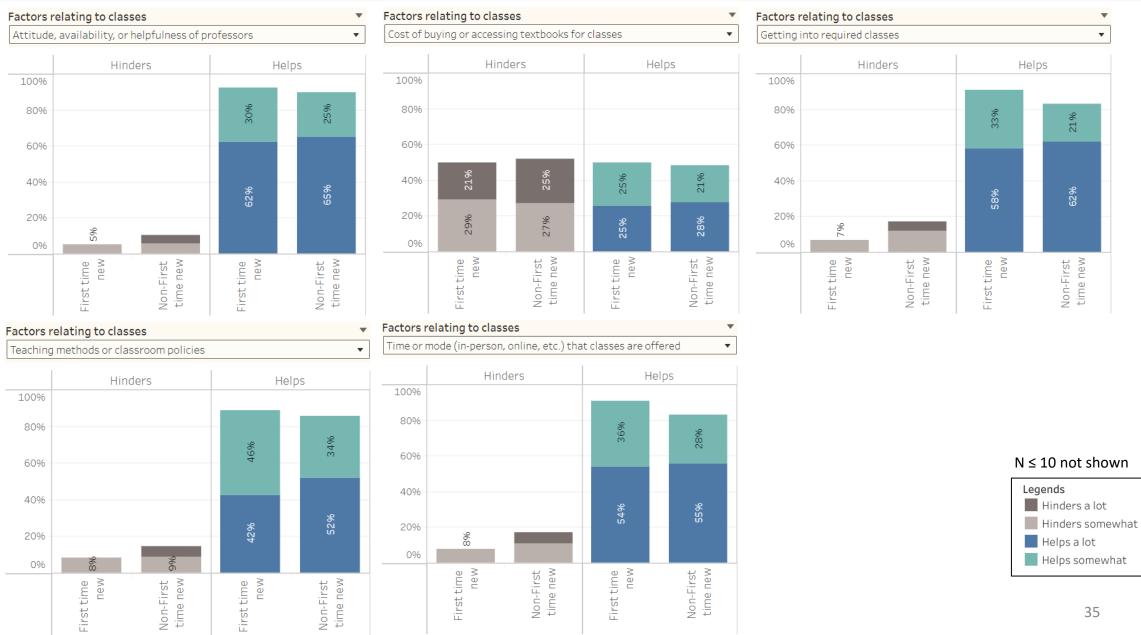

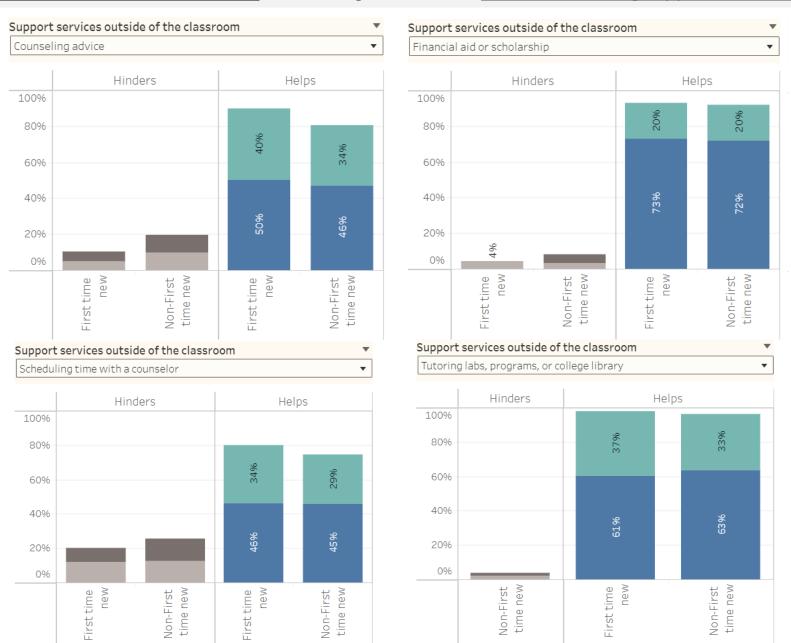
...of students by enrollment status while taking into account factors concerning college, district, or state-wide rules

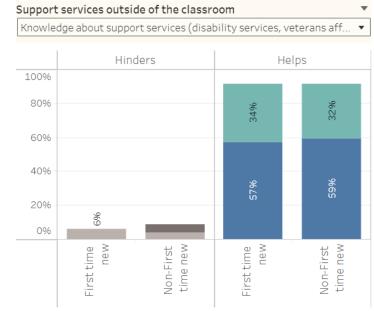


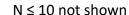
...of students by enrollment status while taking into account factors concerning classes



...of students by enrollment status while taking into account factors concerning support services outside of the classroom



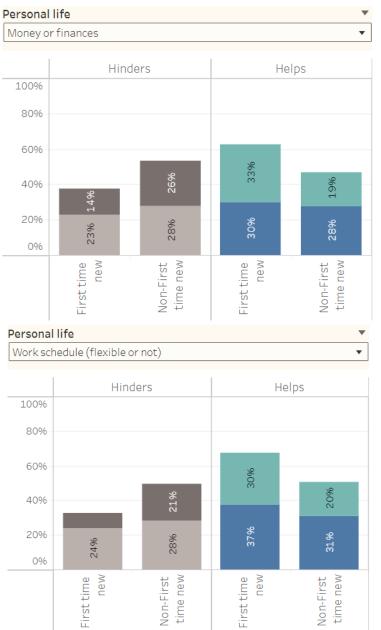


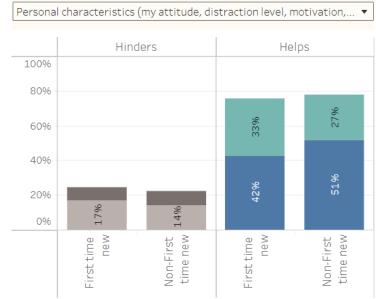


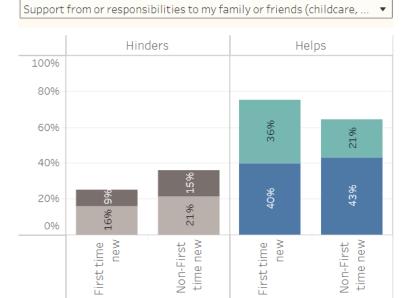
